Accreditation Collection

At the 2019 Australian Gymnastics Championships all State Team Officials will be required to pick up their individual accreditation at the Information Booth at Melbourne Arena.

As all ACT, VIC, QLD, NT, TAS & WA members are issued cards, please ensure that your team officials bring their card Working With Children Check, or equivalent, card with them when they collect their accreditation. As there are no photos on the QLD cards, all QLD team officials must also bring photo ID with them. Without a Working With Children Check, or equivalent card and photo ID no accreditation will be issued.

NSW, NZL & SA team officials are to bring photo ID with them when they collect their accreditation. Gymnastics Australia will have a list of validated Working With Children Check, or equivalent numbers and check photo ID before an accreditation is issued.

This process is in line with best practice and the National Child Safety Statement (http://bit.ly/ChildSafetyCommitmentStatement)

MAG & WAG Podium Training

Podium Training for WAG Junior & Senior International and MAG Senior International, Level 9 Under and Level 10 will be held on Wednesday 22nd May. There will be 2 podium training session

States will be sent a list in the next few weeks of the trophies currently residing with their gymnasts – you will be required to remind the gymnasts to prepare and return the trophy and bring them all to the Orientation meeting

MAG & WAG Team Sheets

MAG & WAG Team sheets are due by **3:00pm Friday 10**th **May**. Please email all completed team sheets to rperini@gymnastics.org.au Any team sheets received after this time will not be accepted.

Please ensure that athlete numbers are included on the team sheets and that all team sheets are legible. Athlete full names must also be used.

Changes to teams are permitted in the case of a medical withdrawal (accompanied by a medical certificate) These changes can take place at the Orientation meeting. Please **do not** resend team sheets after the 10th May.

Team sheets will be emailed out with the allocation of athlete numbers following definitive entries.





RG, AER & ACR Podium Training

RG and AER Podium training will take place on Wednesday 29 May. A detailed schedule will be available following definitive entries.

9:00am – 1:00pm RG Junior International

1:00pm – 4:00pm RG Senior International

4:00pm – 7:00pm AER International Athletes

Athletes will need to be in their **state team training leotard**. Should your state not have an official training leotard then athletes will need to be in a plain black leotard. Athletes will not be permitted to be in crop tops and bike shorts only.

Podium Training for ACR International athletes will take place on Saturday 1st June from 10:30am – 12:30pm. Athletes will need to be in their state team training leotard. Should your state not have an official training leotard then athletes will need to be in a plain black leotard. Athletes will not be permitted to be in crop tops and bike shorts only.

WAG Future International Podium Training

Formal podium training is scheduled for Friday 24th May for WAG Future International Athletes. This session will run very similar to 2018.

Athlete will be expected to be in their state team leotard looking competition ready. No bike shorts will be permitted on the competition floor.

Athletes will rotate apparatus with the MAG athletes like they would if they were competing.

When athletes come to their floor rotation, they will receive 3 mins warm up on the floor following the MAG 3 mins warm up time. Following that, states / groups can decide if they use the time between the MAG floor routines for running WAG floor routines to music or if they would like to use the time for further general floor training keeping in mind the MAG competition will still be taking place so athletes will only have roughly 1mins on the floor between MAG routines. This will need to be decided at the time of the orientation meeting.

During this podium training time, coaches and athletes are not permitted to sit on the judge's tables or on the edge of the podium.

Athletes will not be required to wear their athlete number during podium training.





ASADA Testing

States are reminded that any athletes attending the Australian Gymnastics Championships can be tested by ASADA, regardless of whether they are competing in the Elite/Age Group stream of the National Levels stream. Gymnastics Australia is expecting that testing will be particularly prevalent in an Olympic year at all levels of our championships.

As such we are asking States to ensure that all team members are aware and understand the ASADA testing process and their obligations. This can be achieved through either a face to face session or the ASADA online level 1 module. It is recommended that all state team members complete one of the above training methods ahead of the Australian Gymnastics Championships.

If athletes on your team take regular medication then we recommend they view the ASADA website or call the hotline to check their medication is ok for consumption and if they require to take any action such as completing the TUE process.

WAG D Score Inquiries

Each State is required to nominate one coach for each level, this must be done via a Coach Nomination Form (appendix A) which should be submitted at the Orientation Meeting.

- During the Team Competition (ie day one), each State is permitted to inquire into the D score a maximum of 4 times per level. The 5th and subsequent inquiries will incur a fee of \$50 each time.
 - For individual athletes who are additional to the State team, there is a limit of 1 D score inquiry/athlete at no cost. Second and subsequent inquiries will incur a fee of \$50 each time.
- All inquiries that are upheld will not be included in the count of 4 (for a team) or 1 (for an individual) and will not incur the fee.
- For the Individual All Around/Apparatus Finals (ie day two), each individual athlete is permitted 1 D score inquiry at no cost. Second and subsequent inquiries will incur a fee of \$50 each time.
- All inquiries that are upheld will not be included in the count of 1 and will not incur the fee.
- Each State must nominate one coach per level to submit the D score inquiry.
- A D score inquiry coach nomination form must be submitted by each State at the Orientation Meeting.
- D score inquiries must be submitted to the jury by the end of the rotation in question.

For all addition D score inquiries – states will be invoices \$50 per inquiries after the event.

- 7. Coaches will be responsible for uploading sheets into the main Google Drive folder by using a club folder. No one else will be able to have access to club's folder without NJC permission. Club folder will be emptied once Tariff sheets are organised, however coaches need to resubmit any sheets they will need to upload sheets into Club folder to wait for collection. Difficulty Judges will be given access to collect any re-submitted sheets to re-check.
 - Please ensure folder has the club name as the naming convention
 If coaches aren't Google Drive/computer savvy, contact State Judging Coordinator for assistance prior to the due date.
- 8. Difficulty Judges will contact coaches and inform of Tariff sheets issues, require clarifications, or if any changes are needed. Coaches must ensure that their email address and phone number details are correct on the sheet, so that contact can easily be made regarding sheets.
- 9. Coaches will be required to fix errors quickly and return sheet via uploading to their clubs folder
 DJ1 will collect the sheet to re-check and place the new sheet in the Google File.
 All sheets must be back in the Google file by a specified date (usually 1 week from the initial Tariff Sheet submission).
- 10. After 2nd submission date no more sheets will be able to be submitted via the Google Drive. If coaches do not get their sheets back into their folder so that the Difficulty Judge can re-check, a time to be agreed upon between the DJ and Coach a 0.3 deduction for the late sheet will be applied.
- 11. If coaches need to re-submit a new sheet after the 2nd submission date due to injury, or make a minor change they can do so at the event by **bringing a hard copy** of the sheet.
 - ☐ Coaches should contact the NJC via **text message** to inform that a new sheet is going to be submitted.





New sheets need to be submitted by coaches or a representative, at the start of the Judging meeting after the Orientation Meeting at the event. Sheets must be highlighted to clearly
show the change(s).
Please note that if the injury happens during the National Clubs Event, sheet changes due to an injury must be made a minimum of 30 minutes prior to the commencement of the session with DJ1.
